## Safe driving at roadworks



During 2006 two workers were killed and 19 seriously injured in the course of their work on Highways Agency roads.

For the safety of all road users and roadworkers, when you are approaching roadworks:

- Keep within the speed limit – it is there for your safety.
- Get into the correct lane in good time – don't keep switching.
- Concentrate on the road ahead, not the roadworks.
- Be alert for works' traffic leaving or entering roadworks.
- Keep a safe distance – there could be queues in front.
- Observe all signs – they are there to help you.

*Remember that tiredness can kill. Take regular breaks from driving.*

# Do you know what this → sign is for?

**Answer:** If you ever need to report an accident or breakdown, you can give these letters and numbers to the Emergency Services to tell them exactly where you are.

**A** or **B** indicate the direction you are travelling. (For the M25 **A** is clockwise and **B** is anticlockwise). The numbers refer to the kilometres from Junction 1 on the M25.
